I wish to commend the Board on drafting the guidelines as I think that a discussion needs to be held from an Australian perspective.

As a practising GP I do wish to raise a few concerns in regards the the offer and/or of chaperones in the general practice setting:

The use of chaperones is thought to be inherently different in Australia, in part due to a wide variation in clinician and public attitude (at times historic), diverse cultural influences in the Asia-Pacific region and the unique geographical setting of general practice in Australia.

I think there needs to be consideration for the unique difficulties for GPs in providing chaperones. These are not merely economic reasons but also logistic (e.g. home visit, after-hours care) and the time constraints of general practice consultations.

As it so happens I am doing a small pilot on exactly this topic in the general practice setting, it would be interesting to compare these results with feedback on the draft consultation.
