Revised guidelines, code and policy released today, effective from March 2014

The Medical Board of Australia has released a suite of documents today that will come into effect from mid-March 2014. These documents are:

- revised Good Medical Practice: a code of conduct for doctors in Australia
- revised Guidelines for advertising regulated health services
- · revised Guidelines for mandatory notifications, and
- new Social media policy.

Registered medical practitioners need to familiarise themselves with these documents to ensure their practice meets the Medical Board's expectations when they come into effect.

All the documents other than *Good Medical Practice* are common across all the professions that are regulated through the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme (the National Scheme). Each health practitioner Board has approved the guidelines and *Social media policy*.

The Board reviewed *Good Medical Practice*, the *Advertising guidelines* and the *Mandatory notifications guideline* as part of a scheduled review three years into the National Scheme. These are the first set of revised documents to be released this year, with more to come later in 2014. The *Social media policy* is new and has been developed to address emerging social media issues which are not covered in the *Advertising guidelines* and *Good Medical Practice*.

Medical Board of Australia Chair, Dr Joanna Flynn AM, said National Boards consulted widely late last year on the draft versions of the new guidelines, *Social media policy* and code of conduct.

'The National Boards have an ongoing focus on best practice regulation in the public interest, and in public protection,' Dr Flynn said.

'The experiences from the first three years of the National Scheme were applied when these documents were being reviewed to make sure that they are clear and make it easier for practitioners to understand their obligations, and for members of the community to understand what is expected of health practitioners.'
