To whom it may concern,

I would like to register very deep concern about Section 2.1 of the draft code;

"you need to acknowledge and consider the effect of your comments and actions outside work, including online, on your professional standing and on the reputation of the profession. If making public comment, you should acknowledge the profession's generally accepted views and indicate when your personal opinion differs. Behaviour which could undermine community trust in the profession ... may be considered unprofessional."

Medicine is based on scientific evidence-not on the agreed "consensus" of a collective group of "professionals" deemed to be in charge of the correct group think. This paragraph would seek to stifle enquiry- as well as limit those who see harm being done by those who are in the "generally accepted group". History has shown numerous times when in medicine the "generally accepted" position has proven to be wrong.
